Who is the Driving Instructor's Association?

The Driving Instructor's Association (DIA) was formed in 1978 to promote in the UK and abroad, the interests and welfare of those professionally engaged in driver training, to raise the standards of driver and user education and to create an increased awareness of all aspects of road safety. It is believed to be the largest association of its kind in the world with some 13,500 members.

The DIA is a consultative body to the Department of Transport, Driver Vehicle Licensing Agency (DVLA), Driving Standards Agency (DSA), and the Driver and Vehicle Testing Agency (DVTA).

Diamond Advanced Motorists is the advanced motorist side of the Driving Instructors Association. Entrance to it is by passing either of the two Diamond Advanced Motorist Exams. These advanced tests must be re-taken every three years in order to keep the standard of the member's driving to that of an elitist.

Who is the Motor Schools Association?

The Motor Schools Association of Great Britain (MSA) was formed in March 1935, just before the first driving test was introduced. It was set up to keep driving instructors informed of changes in legislation and to set standards in professional and ethical behaviour, and to advise and assist the general public in obtaining high quality driver training.
